Preparing planters for our coffee morning

New homes for birds, bats and hedgehogs



With the support of the RSPB, birds and bats in Chipping now have some new homes. Sparrows like to live in communities so the RSPB provided terrace bird boxes like the one in

this picture. We also hung nest boxes for swifts and ones with slits underneath for bats. The RSPB also supplied bird homes for Brabins School, so the pupils can monitor

their use. St Mary's Community Wildlife Garden also now has homes for hedgehogs. Built for us by volunteers at HMP Stocken, near Oakham



Sowing seeds in our nectar patch

Every year we dig over and re-seed our annual wildflower nectar patch in the St Marys Community Wildlife Garden. This year, pupils and teachers from Brabins Endowed Primary School joined us to prepare the ground, sow the seeds and water them in. It has been very dry weather,

so the watering is very important! We look forward to having poppies, cornflowers and corn camomile later in the year.



Meadow Surveys - Boland AONB

Chipping in Bloom volunteers carried out surveys of meadow grass and flower species at Wood End Farm, Dunsop Bridge on behalf of the Yorkshire Dales Millennium Trust. Species-rich meadows support more priority wildlife and plant species than any other habitat type. The Trust is working with landowners to restore meadows across the Forest of Bowland.



Chipping Community Help Out Day 2025

Around 50 enthusiastic volunteers joined Chipping in Bloom and Parish Council to help out and clean up our village. The green, historic centre of the village and community wildlife garden are now tidy, weed and litter-free, and swept. Afterwards, everyone met at St Mary's Parish Hall for refreshments kindly provided by the Parish Council.

The seeds will be dried and stored for sowing next spring. The same young people had sowed seeds for the nectar patch earlier this year, so were able to follow the flowering cycle of these plants.
